NEEDS, WANTS, & DREAMS

The words above apply to our personal lives as well as our community lives. We all struggle sometimes with what is actually needed in our lives, what is wanted and what dreams and visions we have for our future. We have the same questions in county government.

In our personal situations we need shelter, food, clothing, a source of income, transportation, safe environment, meaningful relationships, medical assistance, etc. We want much more. Better shelter, better food, nicer clothing, better jobs, nicer or multiple cars, a boat, more jewelry-- the list can go on forever. Our dreams or vision for the future may include retirement, with lots of the wants, a great education for our children, means to spoil our grandchildren, little or lots to do, and freedom to explore new places and/or things.

In county government our needs take a little different scope. Our number one need is public safety. Without feeling safe, the needs and wants of our citizens suffer and there is little vision for the future. We also need to provide adequate means of transportation, good roads, traffic control, and ease of mobility. We want the public to have recreational activities, cultural activities, entertainment, and a sense of well-being or higher quality of life. Funds for our needs and many of our wants have been met through the approval of our SPLOST programs by our citizens.

The dreams and vision of a county usually depend on the people in office and the input from the population. I have been very fortunate in the past thirteen years, to realize many of my particular dreams for our county. A new and better fire department with many new stations and equipment; a great system of libraries, a county-wide no-smoking ordinance; additional sports opportunities and facilities for our youth; a new animal services facility; a new health department; illuminated street signs; an Exhibition Center; a world class public park, playground, and dog park; the groundwork for our own hospital, and an Evans downtown concept that includes a large cultural center.

Our recently completed "Vision 2035" for Columbia County indicates that our citizens desire expanded infrastructure,

higher quality construction and neighborhood amenities, enhanced recreation opportunities, greater conservation plans, more parks, greenways and bike paths, greater economic development, and more master planning. In essence, what we would like to be is a model county comparable to places such as Hilton Head, SC, Peachtree City, GA, Scottsdale, AZ, Summerville, SC, Greenville, SC, and several others. This is also the vision of the County Commission.

In researching the above cities and some of our benchmark counties, we discovered that they all seem to have three things in common: They all have expanded public facilities, parks, greenways and greenspace, bike and golf cart paths, facilities for concert and cultural activities, and other "Quality of Life" features. Secondly, they all have very strict regulations pertaining to housing and commercial development. They have very strict sign ordinances and public display rules. Thirdly, they all have tax rates much higher than Columbia County. I assume you would expect that since all of the amenities they have must have a funding source.

We have recently begun to tighten our housing regulations and thanks to our citizens, our SPLOST program beginning in 2017 has monies for our portion of a new hospital. Unfortunately, however, we will have very little improvements and expansion for our parks and recreation facilities if the hospital becomes a reality. We have funds for a cultural center that has been determined to be too small to really meet our growing needs. We also have funds to complete some projects such as the Justice Center expansion and two public safety projects for the Sheriff that funds were not available in the previous SPLOST because of the recession. Unfortunately, our revenue sources, property taxes and sales taxes, have not continued the growth pattern of years prior to the recession. Our needs are well covered, we have the required surplus to maintain our AAA bond rating and our budget is balanced with no tax increase. SPLOST and TIA (T-SPLOST) are providing our road expansion needs, and we are really in good financial shape. Our wants are being met, but not as rapidly as we would like. My concern is that our dreams and vision for the future may be on hold for a while without additional funding.

Well, you are saying here it comes...a huge tax increase. Nope. To raise property tax is out of the question. We, as a government, can do that, but I will not vote for it. So, if we want to move faster to realize our goals in "Vision 2035", what do we do? We simply ask our citizens, in the form of a referendum, if they would like to accelerate our dreams and vision for the future with funding for a specific list of "Quality of Life" improvements geared to the citizen input for "Vision 2035".

During the recession beginning in late 2008 Columbia County government reduced property taxes in three separate years to benefit our homeowners during the lean years. These reductions amounted to over 10 percent of the county portion of the property taxes. For that same amount we could provide for 50 million dollars of county enhancements. This would accelerate our visions by twenty or more years. Several new parks comparable to Evans Towne Center Park, parking structures for the new Plaza, enlarged cultural center, additional greenways and walking/biking paths, a modern baseball facility suitable for regional and national tournaments, and many others. For \$50.00 per year per \$100,000.00 property value, we could provide adequate funding. This would be a tax deductible expense also.

This, of course, is the beginning of our discussions to realize a vision. To reach the status of other communities that have enjoyed success, rate of growth and have become the envy of other communities. Next month we will go into more detail of the specific projects and the method of financing. Nobody likes taxes or fees, but to see great things happening in Columbia County is exciting.

STORM WATER UTILITY DEPT.

WHEN THINKING OF STORMWATER THINK GREEN

Clean water. A healthy environment. Economic prosperity. Community well being. These are the driving forces behind what Columbia County Stormwater does.

The mission of Stormwater Utility is to promote and protect the health, safety, and welfare of the public. Eliminating pollution contained in storm water runoff is considered the most efficient and cost effective method of reducing pollution in natural water bodies. Only RAIN and clean water should be going down a storm drain. All other things may cause pollution, harm aquatic life, or cause flooding.

Our expert maintenance workers find many undesirable things put into the storm drains that can pollute our natural water bodies. This is considered illegal dumping. Some examples of what they find daily are: plastic bags full of pet waste, trash, oil, chemicals, fertilizers, pesticides, car wash detergents, shrubs and leaves.

How can you help? Do not throw things down the drains! Find a waste receptacle to dispose of things. You may not think you make a big difference however it all adds up. Everything we do to nature changes it forever. Do not let things flow down the storm drain unless it is clean water. This includes leaves, grass & soil. Why? Because foliage and sediment builds up in urban waters and can adversely affect aquatic life and water quality.



- Dispose of trash properly.
- Find a waste receptacle to throw trash into.
- Don't litter.
- Do not let soaps or chemicals reach the storm drains. Limit use & go green with low phosphate soap.
- Pet waste- fecal bacteria –causes lower water quality! Pick up after pets and dispose of waste in trash cans.
